Sitting with God - Practice just sitting with God.

We're Going to Die!

You may never have been with a group of people who were facing a near death experience but you probably have made a statement like, "There's no way that can or will ever happen."

Pete Maravich (known as Pistol Pete) is the NCAA men's basketball all time leading scorer since 1968. At 40 years old he was playing basketball with guys at the gym and fell over dead from heart failure. He had no known history of heart disease any where in his family. His word's to his friends that day while playing was, "I feel great." Matthew 24:36 says, "...no one knows the day or the hour..." the Lord will return or when they will meet Jesus face to face.

But here is one of the most famous "near death" stories ever. Jesus and His disciples are in a boat on a lake when a furious storm begins without warning and throws waves over the boat. If any of you have been on a small boat when a huge storm hits, it's terrifying. The men yell at Jesus, "Save us, we're going to drown!" You all know the rest of the account, Jesus calms the storm with a word.

The point of all this is about these men. The same guys that were afraid of this storm became—warriors for Jesus. They changed the world! What changed them? How did they go from being afraid of a little storm to be willing to die for the advancement of the Gospel! How did they become men willing to be imprisoned, beaten, nailed to a cross, and stoned!? What changed? Well it's pretty simple, they walked day in and day out with Jesus! They spent time with Him, they asked Him questions, and He was a part of every aspect of their lives for about 3 years. And they were filled with the Holy Spirit. This was there training, they became warriors of Christ, willing to lay down their lives for... Him! No matter what! They were all in!

Purity Principle | Quote

Someone said, "The richest man in the world is not he who has the most, but he who needs the least." Think about contentment! Real life is experienced by those who are content and at complete peace with God right where they are. God is enough!

As a Christian man, you can't have **peace & contentment** if sexual lust is running through your veins. As you break free from the bondages of lust, you will start to experience a "peace that goes beyond understanding." This will be one of your greatest joys and incentives to stay free! Soon, you won't need or want anything to make you happy... except Jesus! This is a great place to be. In your words, why is this true?

5 Minutes with God - Talk | Listen | Journal

Twice in Chapter 10, Paul emphasizes the Old Testament was written to be an example for us. We are to **learn** from their **mistakes** and be **warned** of the consequences of sin. What was the consequence of sexual immorality in V8? What were the consequences of their grumbling & complaining in V10? Talk with God today about what He wants you to learn from His Word. Don't shame yourself over this, just LEARN!

Men, we have been "called" to not set our hearts on evil things (V6). You were "called" by God to live your life in such a way as to WIN the prize! Meditate on this, and put your faith into action.

DAY 2

Confess | Learn | Adjust

Be with God. Be still with Him. Make connecting this way with God a daily habit. Don't let the little things build up. Write down anything you have not dealt with yet this week.

What is God saying to you in 1 Corinthians 3 today?

Reflection Verse - 1 Corinthians 2:14-16

"The person without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God but considers them foolishness, and cannot understand them because they're discerned only through the Spirit. **15** The person with the Spirit makes judgments about all things... because you have been given... **the mind of Christ.**" Based on this scripture would you say you're a man with the Spirit?

Purity Principle | Quote | Thought

"It is not scientific doubt, not atheism, not pantheism, not agnosticism that is likely to quench the light of the Gospel. It is a proud, sensuous, selfish, church-going, hollow-hearted, prosperous, Christian!" said Francis Chan in his book, Profile of the Lukewarm. Boom!

Historically, it has been the **religious people** who discredit God as they point a bony, self-righteous finger at others. **Servant or Hypocrite? Which will you be?** When people watch how you live, will they want to be a Christian?

To represent Christ well, we must be **gracious people** who take others to drink at the well of. the **throne of grace**. We must not act as if we are perfect and then lay that burden on others. Paul is our example: He said, "I will boast gladly about my weakness... When I am weak then I am strong." Jesus said, "My power is made perfect in weakness."

Self-righteous, narcissistic, prideful men will not typically find recovery for themselves or their marriages. Describe how you can be a man's man yet walk in brokenness & humility.

Confess Setbacks & Victories | Learn | Adjust

"Do not be overcome by evil but overcome evil with good." Romans 12:21 What good have you done or what victories have you had this week that have overcome evil? Describe them below:

Read | Reflect | Transform - 1 Corinthians 5:1-13... Tough teaching today! What was God impressing on you as you read this passage today?

What steps can you take to apply this to your life? How could this change you?

Pray about this Verse Long & Hard: 1 Corinthians 5:11 God hates sin but loves you! Now I am writing to you that you must not associate with anyone **who calls himself a brother but is** sexually immoral or... a drunkard.... with such a man do not even eat.

Purity Principle | Quote | Thought | Prayer

One of my brother-in-law's favorite sayings is, "You become what you do." I'd like to add, "You will do what you've become." According to God's Word, we are new creations (2 Corinthians 5:17). If this is true, we should act and make our decisions based on who we have become, a child of God! We have been washed, sanctified, and indwell an empowered by the Holy Spirit. God says we are to live lives "worthy of our calling." Ephesians 4:1

We are His kids. We're King's kids! We are chosen, hand picked!

We'll never **reflect Him** perfectly because we are a work in progress, but being His child should change us. Whom do you see when you look in the mirror? Write down what God is saying to you about this metamorphose you have experienced:

Going Deep with God - Talk | Listen | Journal

The man in the reading today was sexually immoral and also a part of their church. **He called himself a brother**. Notice in V11 that it's ok to judge this man's actions without judging him. They loved him so much they were willing to take harsh steps to deal with his sin **so that his soul was saved**. **His salvation was the goal!** What is your reaction to this passage?
