DAY 1

Confess | Learn | Adjust

How'd you live your yesterday? What can you learn from it? Do you need to adjust?

Connection Passage - Psalm 19:1-4, 13, 14

V1 The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of His hands. V2 Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge. V3 They have no speech, they use no words; no sound is heard from them. V4 Yet their voice goes out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world. In the heavens God has pitched a tent for the sun...

How do these verses speak to you?

The heavens proclaim God's existence, His power, His care, and His love! We are on a ball of matter flying through space, orbiting around the sun at **67,000 mph** while spinning at roughly **1,000 mph**. We worry about a lot of things, but we don't even realize we trust God daily to keep us safe as we travel through space! Read Romans 1:20, then write out the definition of the following words from the dictionary.

The Challenge

Read the verses below and keep an attitude of worship as you read the words. Cry out to God to help you battle against **fleshly temptations.** Slowly read one word at a time and **pray** about what it meaning to you! Example for the word "**keep**" below in V13.

Lord, it blows my mind that you want to "keep" me close to you! You want to spend eternity with me. You chose me! And you will actually help me stay away from willful sin. Thank you!"

V13 "Keep your servant from willful sins; may they not rule over me."

As you read the following Psalm, ask God in what ways are the words of your mouth not pleasing to Him. Then ask Him how your thoughts displease Him! Now ask Him to help you change through the power of the Holy Spirit!

V14 "May the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be pleasing in Your sight, O Lord, my Rock and my Redeemer."

Holy, Holy, Holy is our God

The creator of everything has called you and I to serve Him and His people. Ask Him how you can best serve Him here on this planet. Is it at Revive40?

DAY 6

Confess | Learn | Adjust

Is there anything from the week you have not dealt with yet? Thoughts drifting into unhealthy areas? Emotions that are controlling you? Relationships that aren't right? Any hiding? Isolating? Pride? Etc...? What can you learn from your struggles and what adjustments can you make to help you live a life filled with the Joy of the Lord?

Replacement Theory

Replacement theory is a term some counselors use to describe the process of removing old ways of **destructive thinking and** replace these thoughts with **healthy thoughts** based on the truth of the Word of God. This is the reason we emphasize memorizing the "**3 Must Statements**" so much. These statement when consistently applied will change your life! Here is an explanation of each one and why they work.

1. New You - This statement is primarily helping you transform your identity as a Christian male. This is who God says you are; not what people say, not what your past behaviors says, and especially not what you have called yourself at times you have failed.

2. New View - Is a transformative statement that helps you develop a new way to look at women. This statement can reverse years of cultural programing and help you to have a health way to think about women that consider with the Lords.

3. Framing - Is a statement of your personal reality. When we act out as Christian men we typically compartmentalize who we are when temptation strikes. In other words we put out of our mind that we're a Christian. It's hard to act out if your thinking about your family, the testimony you want to be to others, your responsibilities of being a man of God, etc...

These statement will help transform your thinking and help you break free from from willful sin that has been hindering you for years. These statements need to be simple to memorize, be Biblically based, and used constantly as your thoughts drift into inappropriate areas or temptation is lingering around you! Recite to be refreshed and to get right with Jesus.

Reflect | Memorize One!

Write down a scripture this week that will help you defeat your enemy in times of being triggered. Memorize this verse and use it often. Everyone needs a "**new go to scripture!**"

DAY 5 Confess | Learn | Adjust

Connection Scriptures - Psalm 25:1-2, 8-10, 15-17, 21

V1 To You, O Lord, I lift up my soul; In You I trust, O Lord my God. V2 Do not let me be put to shame, nor let my enemies triumph over me.

V8 Good and upright is the Lord; therefore He instructs sinners in His ways. *V9* He guides the humble in what is right and teaches them His way. *V10* All the ways of the Lord are loving and faithful toward those who keep the demands of His covenant. *V15* My eyes are ever on the Lord, for only He will release my feet from the snare. *V16* Turn to me and be gracious to me, for I am lonely and afflicted. *V17* The troubles of my heart have multiplied; free me from my anguish. Look upon my affliction and my distress and take away my sins.

V 21 May integrity and uprightness protect me; because my hope is in You.

Enemies are anyone or anything that opposes us. Almost half of the Psalms address attacks from our enemies. In V2, David asked God that he wouldn't be put to shame by his enemies. **Ask God to help you triumph over the enemies below that are opposing you.**

David trusted God with his **soul** in V1. Most Biblical scholars agree that the soul is comprised of the three parts **1**) **mind 2**) **will and 3**) **emotions.** Turn over full control of the three parts of your soul to God right now. Tell Him how you would like to grow in these areas. Spend at least "3" minutes praying about each of them.

Repent IReplace (false beliefs with truth) **I Reset**

When we confess we need to more importantly repent. We need to agree with God that we're sinning but we must also turn from the sin and **turn to God**. Identify any false beliefs and reset your thinking with the Truth.

Connection Verses - Psalm 20:1, 4, 7, 22:1-3

Psalm 20 is a prayer asking to be victorious in battle and may have been written after the events in 2 Samuel 10 where David and his men defeat the Ammonites. **What are your major battles right now?** Willful sin? A relationship? Finances? Anxiety? Worry? Loneliness? List "3" of your current life battles below:

Read the two verses below that deal with **trusting God** in our battles and in the trials of life. Then write a short note to God telling Him how you will **trust Him** in your three major battles listed above!

1. Joab said, *"Be strong and let us fight bravely for our people and the cities of God. The Lord will do what is good in His sight."* 2 Samuel 10:12

Note to God:

As you read V4 below, remember it's ok to ask God to give you "the desires of your heart," but it's important to **TRUST HIM** to do what's best for you. Are you willing to let God do *"what is good in HIS sight*"as Joab said above in Samuel?

"*May He grant you the desires of your heart, and make all your plans succeed.*" Psalm 20:4

Are you willing to let God "change you" so the desires of **your heart** become the desires of **His heart?**

Time to get real right as you read V7 below. God has sent you to fight against an army that is bigger and stronger than you! Would you be looking at the number of chariots, horses, and army size, or would you be willing to trust God in this battle against all odds? Why or why not?

"Some trust in chariots and some in horses but we trust in the name of the Lord our God." Psalm 20:7

The Challenge

V1 My God, my God, why have You forsaken me? Why are You so far from saving me, so far from my cries of anguish? V2 My God, I cry out by day, but You do not answer, by night, but I find no rest. V3 Yet You are... the Holy One... "Psalm 22:1-3

According to the above passage, did God always answer David's cries for help? **Can you relate to David?** Reflect on this phrase: "**Let God be God.**" Ask God to give you a heart like David's that realizes at the end of the day that God is the Holy One, Messiah, Creator, and Savior! Pray: Lord, may Your will be done, not mine. Help me to accept that! Amen

Stupid Blind Faith?

Trusting God isn't a cope out to just be stupid. Pray and ask God for guidance in your battles, ask other men's counsel, and then put your decision and the results into His hands.

DAY 3

Repent | Replace | Reset

Repent and turn from anything that is hindering your life at this time. Replace your sin with a healthy alternative that would be a blessing to God. Then reset your life to be victorious. What is God saying to you at this time?

Connection Passage - Psalm 23:1-6

V1The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want. V2 He makes me lie down in green pastures, He leads me beside still waters, V3 He restores my soul. He leads me along paths of righteousness for His name's sake. V4 Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff comfort me. V5 You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. V6 Surely Your goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

It's Easy to Say I'm Loving

DAY 4

Confess Setbacks | Celebrate Victories | Learn | Adjust

Today, ask God to show you what you need to confess or even better what you need to celebrate. What can you learn from your good and not so good decisions. Adjustment needed?

Connection Passage - Psalm 24:1-6

The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it; V2 for He founded it on the seas and established it on the waters. V3 Who may ascend the mountain of the Lord? Who may stand in His holy place? V4 He who has clean hands and a pure heart, who does not lift his soul to an idol (anything you make more important than God) or swear by what is false. V5 He will receive blessing from the Lord and vindication from God their Savior. V6 Such is the generation of those who seek Him, who seek Your face, O God of Jacob.

What is God's purpose in putting these type of statements in V1-2 in the Bible? Reflect on what these mean to you in your daily **struggle against the flesh**?
